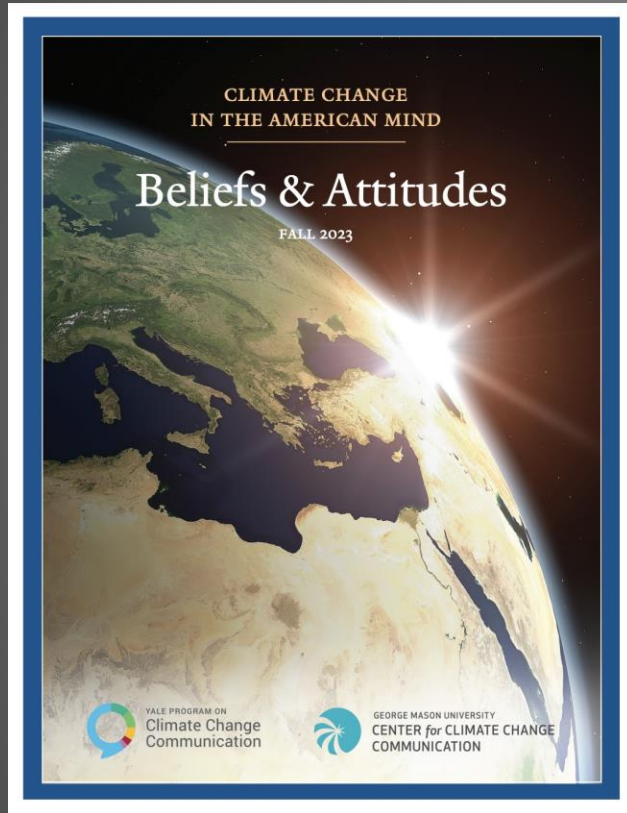

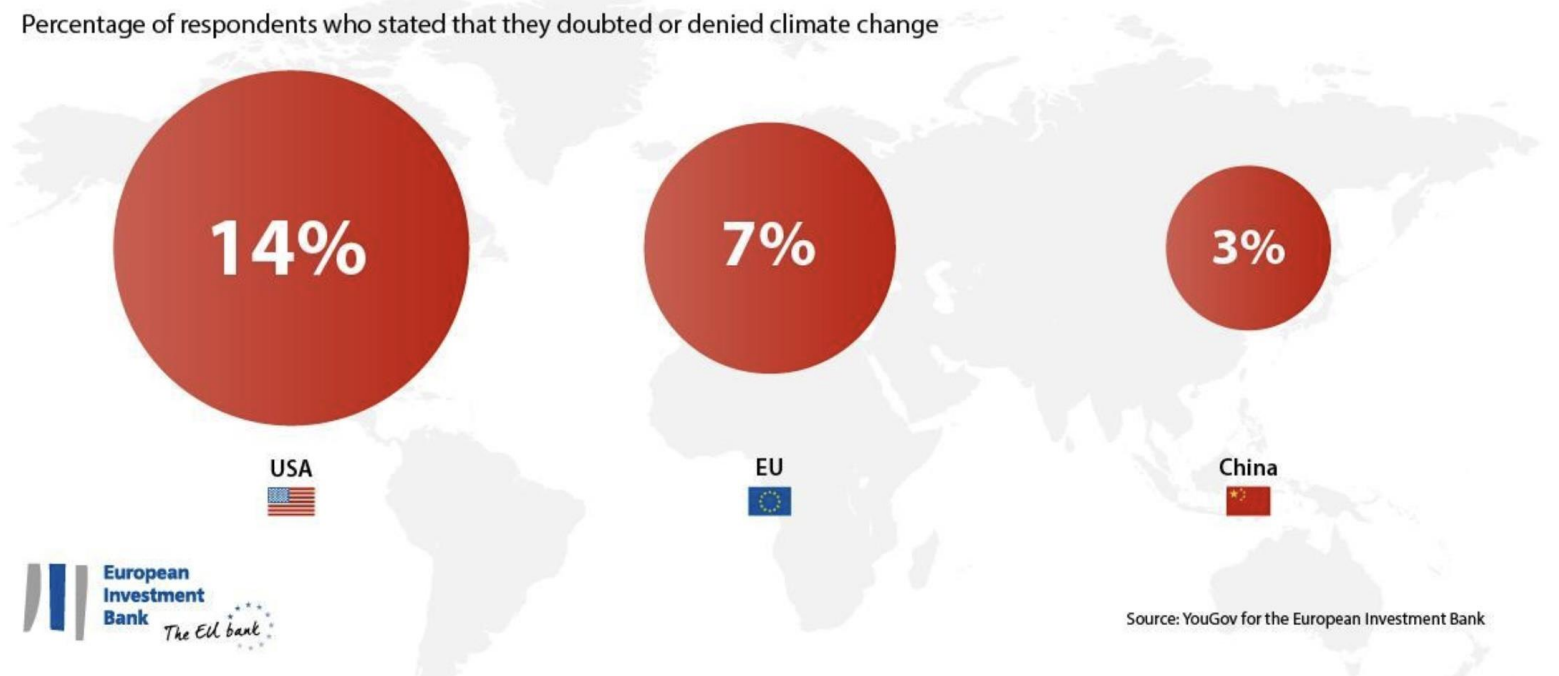

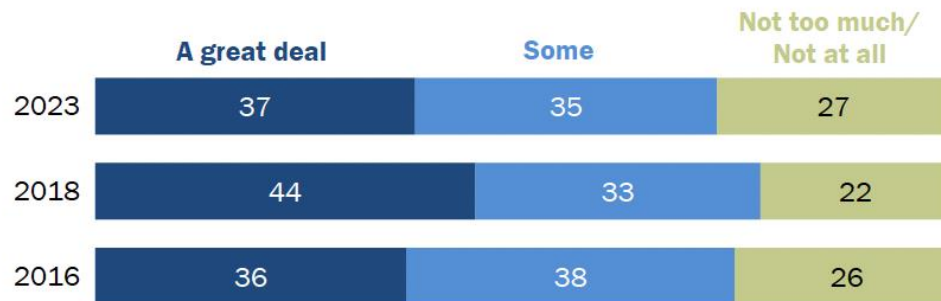

Here are just some of the reports coming in.

First, the number of communities that have now voted to reject membership in the International Council for Local Environmental Initiatives (ICLEI) has climbed to ten. This is the UN associated group that helped create Agenda 21 in 1992 and is now working in more than 600 American cities to enforce Sustainable Development policy.

The ten communities who have voted to reject their contracts with ICLEI include: **Carroll County, MD; Amador County, CA; Montgomery County, PA; Edmond, OK; Las Cruces, NM; Spartanburg, SC; Albemarle County, VA; Plantation, FL; James City County, VA; and most recently, Lexington, VA.**

Daily, I hear from activists from hundreds more communities fighting to join the list. In many communities, anti-Agenda 21 candidates are now appearing on ballots. In some communities, like **Pulaski County, Virginia**, if there are no candidates from the major parties running in opposition to Agenda 21, then right-in candidates are challenging them.

Second, I have just returned from an extensive 10 day tour of **Idaho, Oregon, Washington and Montana** where I spoke to enthusiastic audiences, was interviewed by the news media and met with several state legislators and county commissioners.

In the **Washington state legislature**, **Rep. Matt Shea** reports the creation of an **anti-Agenda 21 Caucus**. That will help us defeat new Agenda 21 legislation.

The UN climate summit reached a weak outline of a global agreement in Copenhagen tonight, falling far short of what Britain and many poor countries were seeking and leaving months of tough negotiations to come.

After eight draft texts and all-day talks between 115 world leaders, it was left to Barack Obama and Wen Jiabao, the Chinese premier, to broker a political agreement. The so-called Copenhagen accord "recognises" the scientific case for keeping temperature rises to no more than 2C but does not contain commitments to emissions reductions to achieve that goal.

The draft report, which strings together proposals from various working groups, quickly raised alarm among climate change skeptics.

Marc Morano, a former aide to U.N. agitator and Republican Sen. [Jim Inhofe](#), told FoxNews.com the document shows the climate talks are intended to create more "taxing and regulatory authority."

Mr. Farley admitted, "The adoption of EVs is a bit slower in the industry than we expected," but mollified this by adding, "But we continue to see more and more customers interested in EVs."

The same group of Republican attorneys general recently sent similar requests to numerous asset managers and to **proxy advisory firms** ISS and Glass Lewis. The inquiries are part of a sprawling Republican campaign against the use of environmental, social and governance criteria in investing.
